Stained glass, iridized glass, vitreous glass, 24k gold smalti, smalto, and glass rods Description: Monoecious - having unisexual reproductive units of both sexes appearing on the same plant; from Greek for "one household". Individuals bearing flowers of both sexes at the same time are called simultaneously or synchronously monoecious. This mosaic was originally designed as a female flower, possessing only an ovary. With over a 100 hours into this piece, I was down to the finale and last panel, when my husband,a weed ecologist, kindly gave me a brief tutorial of plant biology. With a burst of excitement my husband and I sat side by side and created the male stamens using glass rods. Thus this mosaic flower spontaneously became monoecious.

Floating to the Surface is an expression of my creative journey from 2005-2012. Within this mosaic are hundreds of fragments of shells that I have collected over many years. Growing up on and off of Tybee Island, GA is where I return every year to rejuvenate my soul and during those solitary walks on the beach are hours spent collecting ocean worn fragments of shells. All of the oyster shells and conch pieces have come from Tybee Island. Most of the coral and other shells have been collected along the coastlines of Florida, Hawaii and Belize. I gather the shells one at a time to create palettes of color. I imagine the journey of the shells, the years and years of ocean life and time spent tumbling in the waves and crashing into the sand. Worn out and uncollected by most beach goers, these shells represent the beauty of time and add a wonderful richness to my work. This mosaic is so much about the process of art making and gathering. The entire mosaic took over five months to piece together.
